

Reflection Board

What Is It?

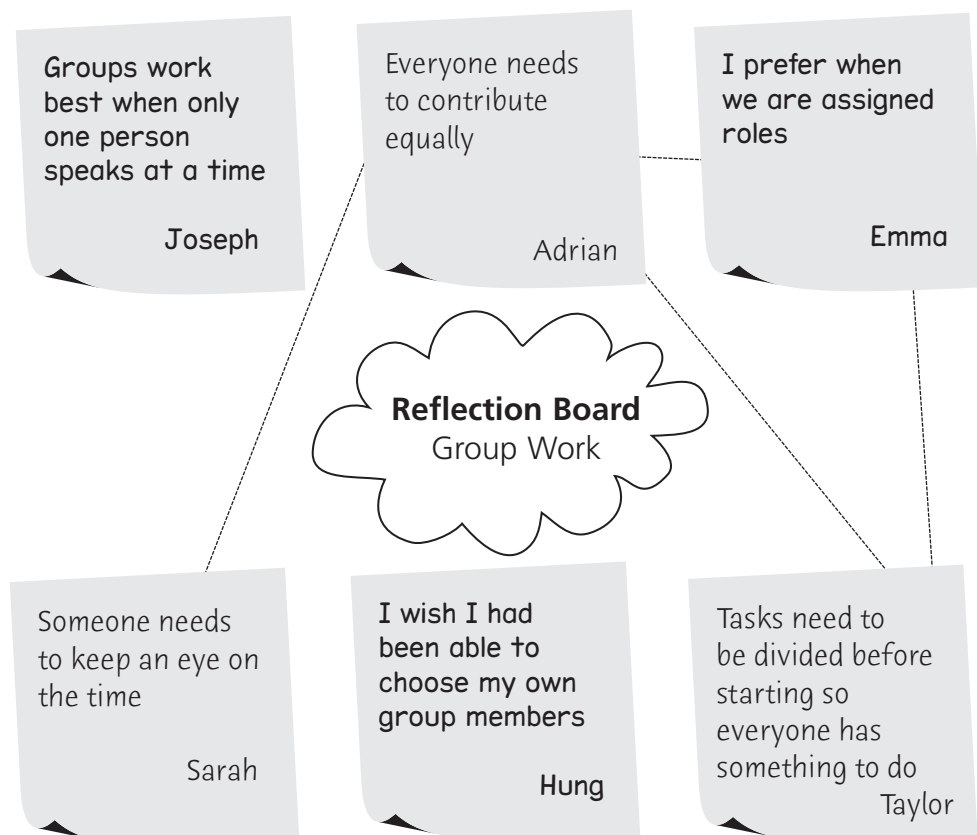
Reflection Board is an activity that provides students with an opportunity to reflect on their learning by hearing the responses from other learners.

Why Use It?

Metacognitive awareness is developed when students are given the opportunity to reflect on a range of responses. Reflection Board provides a framework for students to share responses within a larger group.

How Do You Use It?

1. Establish a space in the learning environment to display individual or group reflections.
2. Provide students with a specific topic or task on which to base their reflections.
3. Provide time for students to record reflections on slips of paper and attach to the display area.
4. Have students draw or make links between their reflections and others recorded on the display board.
5. Provide opportunities for students to discuss the reflections and links made.



Possible Adaptations

- Rather than use a display board, a computer-based shared site can be created and operated in a similar way.
